

A More Than God

Picture this—you are in charge of an orphanage full of children from all backgrounds, and age groups. At dinner time, the famished children run into the kitchen expecting to fill their stomachs. They sit down, surrounding you at the dinner table. There's only one glitch—there is no food on the table. The children look around wondering where the food is. You think to yourself, “God promised that He would provide for every need, but what am I going to tell them?”

Can you put yourself in those shoes? Could you imagine what the famous George Mueller was thinking that day? Fear? Worry? No. George Mueller calmly told the children to bow their heads so he could bless the food. Imagine that! He was praying for food that was not there! Being that he believed in a faithful God, the moment they said, “Amen,” there was a knock at the door. On the doorstep was enough food to feed the whole orphanage! Why? Mueller did not place any limitations on God. He knew the secret! Mueller knew that he served a “*more than*” God. He's not just enough, He's more than enough!

Ephesians 3:17b-21 (NIV), states, “And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to Him who is able to do immeasurably *more than* all we ask or imagine, according to His power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.” In other words, God can do more than you could ever think or imagine!

God did far “*more than*” enough for George Mueller and those children that night! Why wouldn't God be able to do the same for you? Our **perspective** does not change God's **position**. Our circumstances, obstacles, or problems cannot change who God is. He is still more than able. God is much bigger than all these things. In fact, “The earth is the Lord's and the fullness there of” (*Psalms 24:1 & 1 Corinthians 10:26*). For every dream and vision you may have, God is “*more than*.” It doesn't matter if the enemy told you “no”—in Christ, all things are possible, and He will tell you, “yes!”

When Moses asked God for a name (*Exodus 3:13-14*), God replied, “I Am, that I Am.” “*I Am*” is the verb for “to be.” He was telling Moses, “Hey Moses! The very core and existence of life is me! I have no death in me—I AM! Every need you have—I AM! Everything you see and so much more—I AM! He is not “just enough,” He is a “*more than*” God!

We, as a society, tend to look for a super hero in politics, primary economics, medicine, and even entertainment. Let me tell you that God is our Super Hero. The one factor that separates our God from other “super heroes” is that He has no flaw. There is not any Kryptonite that can slow Him down—He is unstoppable! He is a “*more than*” God!

Romans 1:21-23, 25 (*The Message Translation*) says this, “What happened was this: People knew God perfectly well, but when they didn’t treat him like God, refusing to worship him, they trivialized themselves into silliness and confusion so that there was neither sense nor direction left in their lives. They pretended to know it all, but were illiterate regarding life. They traded the glory of God who holds the whole world in his hands for cheap figurines you can buy at any roadside stand . . . And they worshipped the god they made, instead of the God who made them—the God we bless, the God who blesses us.”

The question is: are we worshipping a limited God, which we have created in our minds, or do we worship the incomprehensible, eternal, omniscient (*all knowing*), omnipotent (*all powerful*), omnipresent (*limitless*), King of Kings and Lord of Lords who is “*more than*”?
